A Word From Our Pastor:



Carolyn and I want to thank you as a church for the expressions of love shown to us in October. You will never know how much we appreciated each word, card, or gift. We consider ourselves blessed by God to be able to serve our Lord alongside you here at Lynn Garden Baptist Church.

One of our grandchildren prays so simply, but so sincerely. Even if we're giving God thanks for the food, this child will share the names of whoever is on his heart at the time, and this year, I've noticed

he always prays "for this coronavirus." You know, his prayers touch my heart, and I know they touch the heart of God. I truly believe God hears the prayers of children. Why? Because of their honesty and sincerity. Matthew 6:7-8 "But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking. Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him." 'Vain repetitions' refer to useless babbling. It's a prayer filled with empty words and phrases.

Jesus told the people that the power of prayer is not found in its length or the "right" words. The Pharisee in Jesus' parable in Luke 18, used prayer as a way of getting public recognition. He prayed to be seen and heard by people around him. So then, what does God look for when He listens to our prayers? I'm sure that many things could be said, but let me point out just two:

- 1) God looks for prayers that are sincere. They should come from our heart. The publican in Jesus' parable of Luke 18, prayed - "God be merciful to me a sinner," a short prayer indeed, but Jesus said that he went home justified in the sight of God. In other words, his prayer was answered.
- 2) God looks for prayers that are of simple child-like faith. Note again what Jesus said in Matthew 6:8 - "....for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him."

Prayer is not us trying to persuade a reluctant God to hear us and help us. Prayer is us putting ourselves in a position where God can help us. We pray with confidence. Some people are afraid to pray out loud and in front of others for fear that they might not say the right thing. You know, with our grandchild, it doesn't matter if it's just the two of us, or the entire family's there, his prayer will be the same. The truth is, it doesn't matter what one person thinks of another person's prayer. The only thing that matters is what God thinks. Have a great week and let your light shine for Jesus this week.

As the new year approaches, it is time to start thinking about what role you would like to serve in the life of our church. In the next few weeks please begin praying how you feel God is leading you. Below are some areas where the church family needs additional participants.

God's Holy Word tells us...

Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. 1 Peter 4:10

JAM - Jesus and Me Children's Ministry:

JAM Children's Worship: This ministry provides a morning worship service for children ages 4 thru 5th grade. The service incorporates biblical teaching, musical worship, and creative learning.

Jammin' Sunday Nights: The focus of this ministry is to help kids to develop relationships while teaching them to give and grow with each other. We also are developing a puppet ministry.

Nursery/Preschool Ministry Team: This ministry focuses on nurturing and teaching our young children about the love of Jesus Christ. These volunteers rotate on a regular basis as they serve in our nursery and preschool ministry each Sunday morning during worship.

Rootz Student Ministry:

Youth Ministry Team: This ministry focuses on helping our teenagers grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ as well as with other Christians. There are various opportunities to serve in an on-going role in this ministry.

Wednesday Night JAM Ministry:

On Wednesday nights all students meet together for a meal, worship and Bible study. We currently need individuals in all areas.

Joy Garden's (Just Older Youth)

Our senior adults make up this ministry. Currently they are meeting once a month for food and Christian fellowship.

Transportation Ministry Team:

This ministry provides transportation for those who need assistance to attend our worship services.

Greeter/Usher Ministry Team:

Greeters: The Welcome Team strives to set a Christian example of the Body of Christ as members of God's family by giving guests a warm and comfortable welcome. They provide guests with information about the church and place them in appropriate Small Group Bible studies.

<u>Ushers:</u> These men help with taking up the offering and passing out bulletins with a smile to make everyone feel welcome. Security/Patrolling Ushers: This ministry provides security during Sunday worship services for our building and our parking lot.

Sunday School and Small Group Bible Studies:

Our small group Bible studies are the foundational strategies for helping people to grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ and with other believers. There are various groups for all ages. Sunday School meets at 9:45 am and Men's Bible Study on Wednesday morning.

Sound/Audio Visual Ministry Team:

This ministry helps with worship services/events/meetings by providing quality sound and audio-visual enhancement. Training will be provided so experience is not necessary.

<u>Choir and Musicians:</u>

The Choir leads worship in the Sunday morning worship services. If you sing or play an instrument this could be the place for you!

Women on Mission:

This essentially encompasses the "women on mission" of the church. Project JFK (Our ministry to John F. Kennedy Elementary) and the Operation Christmas Child (Shoebox Ministry) are just a couple of the mission opportunities our women take on each year.

The purpose of this ministry is to plan mission/ministry projects and fellowships that bring men together and reach out to our community.

Outreach

COA Team (Community Outreach Activities): This team helps our church to plan and implement various creative outreach events such as Trunk and Treat, Spring Fling, and more.

<u>Card Ministry:</u> This group writes cards to guests and members as a way to provide encouragement and follow up from our church.

Food Ministry Team: This ministry provides food for members during times of grief.

Grief Ministry Team: This ministry provides assistance/ministerial care to our members during times of grief. They help during times of grief by organizing meals, prayer support, counsel, and visits of support and encouragement.
