A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:



A friend of ours recently shared with us a verse that he and his wife have clung to while going through a difficult and challenging time. That verse is Romans 12:12 *“Rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer;”* As I read that verse, I noticed God gives us three things every Christian ought to remember and put into practice: First, “Rejoice in hope,” Paul says. Let the hope that you have in God cause you to live with great joy and delight. Our hope of being right with God

through Christ, our hope of heaven, our hope in the promises of God, and so much more, are reasons to live as people of hope. This hope we have is stronger than the times of uncertainty and fear we all encounter from time to time.

Second, “Be patient in tribulation,” Paul says. Are you in a difficult time of life? Be patient. That’s easier said than done, right? How do we remain patient? By knowing and trusting that God is in control, His timing is perfect, and He does not make mistakes. God is for you. Trust Him. Be patient and rest in Him.

Third, “Be constant in prayer,” Paul says. All too often we pray only as a last resort, when all else has failed. For the believer, prayer should be our starting point, not our last resort. In prayer, we acknowledge our dependence upon God and our inability to carry on without Him. We have the ability to communicate with the God of the universe, and yet too often we fail to use that privilege.

All three of these things are extremely practical. When the difficult times come, the thing to do is to begin with prayer. If you are faithful in prayer, you will be able to be patient in tribulation. You will hang in there, waiting until God, in His own time and in His own way, works things out in the way He has in mind. That will make you rejoice in hope, because as you know

“...greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world.” (1 John 4:4). Have a great week and let your light shine for Jesus this week!

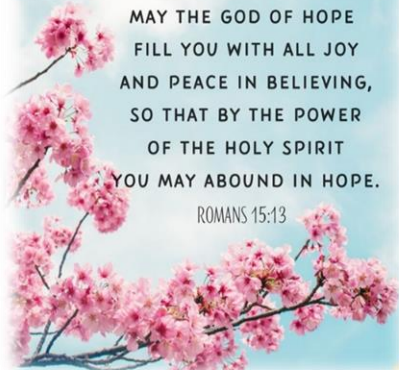

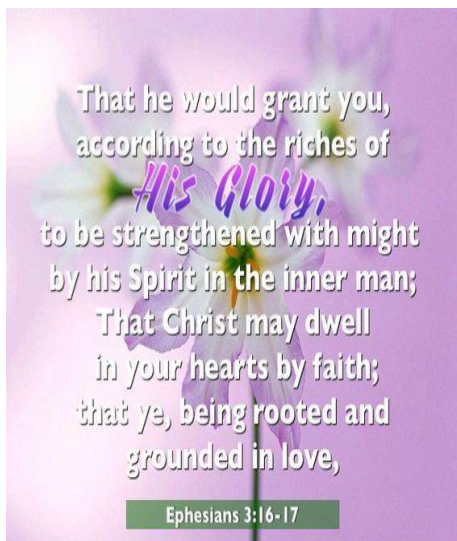

Will you join me in praying for our children, youth, volunteers, and everyone involved as we prepare to kick off VBS 2022 on June 12th?

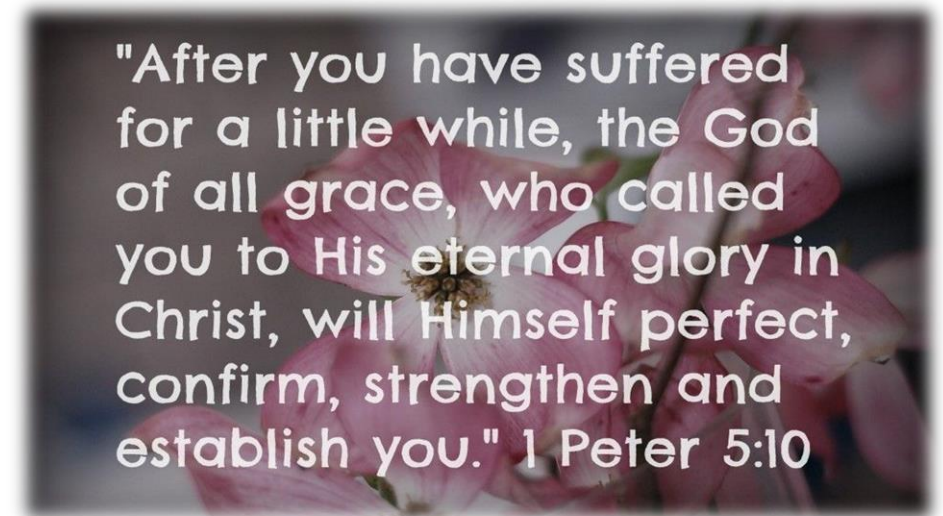
Church Family, I'm excited for us to GLORIFY, GROW, GIVE, and GO as we GROW GOD'S GARDEN together in Summer 2022!
