A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:



God used the prophet Elisha to perform several miracles during his ministry. The one recorded in 2 Kings 6:1-7 is often referred to as "the miracle of the floating axe head." Elijah had started a School of Prophets that had continued expanding under Elijah's successor, Elisha. The number of students attending this school in Gilgal had outgrown their facilities, so with Elisha's approval to enlarge their facility, they began the expansion project. The students in this school went to the river and began

cutting down timber. As they're cutting down some trees, one of the students was cutting a tree and his axe head fell into the water. Now he became really upset because the axe was borrowed. He tells Elisha what happened and Elisha goes to the point in the river where the axe head fell in, cut a stick, threw it into the water and made the ax head float.

I used to wonder what the purpose of this miracle being recorded in God's Word was. Was it just simply to remind us of the power of God? Yes, that is absolutely one reason, but there is another reason. To us, it might sound like such a simple need, but it was a real need to the man who lost the ax head. We might think God would be too busy with larger and more important needs than to be concerned about an ax head that had gotten lost in the river. This miracle illustrates a simple but profound truth: God cares about the small stuff of life—lost ax heads, lost glasses, lost keys, lost cell phones, lost contact lenses—the little things that cause us to fret and worry. But His promise to provide for the needs of His people covers little things as well as big ones. He does not always restore what was lost (for reasons of His own), but He understands our loss and comforts us in our distress.

Next to the assurance of our salvation, the assurance of our Heavenly Father's care is essential. Our concerns are His concerns. Our small worries mean everything to Him because we mean everything to Him. 1 Peter 5:7 reminds us, "*Casting all your care upon him; for he cares for you.*" Have a great week and let your light shine for Jesus this week!

Have you seen videos (Or maybe participated in!) the "Polar Plunge"? Folks who take the Polar Plunge don their summer swimsuits and jump into frigid water in the middle of winter. I love watching videos of the Polar Plunge to see the shock on folks faces as the icy water chills them to the bone! If they weren't

awake before, they certainly are after!

The theme for the Strength to Stand Conference our youth attended in January was "DEEPER." It was an amazing time of worship and hearing God's Word preached! Each speaker focused on how we as Christians can, and should, go deeper in our faith and in our walk with Jesus Christ. I literally wrote a book over the course of the weekend as I took notes and journaled about the sermons.

I want to pull out one particular area focused on by Brian Mills on the last day of the conference. Brian encouraged us to "look for the opportunities in opposition". We need to go "DEEPER" in our purpose...living for Jesus Christ! We will face "purpose robbers" along the way and must be prepared to face them, but we should not use those purpose robbers to put limits on ourselves, put limits on God, or to make excuses.

Folks who take the "Polar Plunge" get a shock to their system when they go "DEEPER" into that icy water. We need to go "DEEPER" in our walk with Christ. We may need a shock to our system of the same severity to wake us up to what God wants to do in us and through us. Our purpose is greater than us, and that purpose is found in our MIGHTY GOD!

Two big takeaways I wrote from Brian's sermon:

- When we choose the ways of God, we see movements take place. 1. 2.
 - God can move in Lynn Garden.

Let us use the hope we have in Jesus as our fuel for movements to take place as we GROW GOD'S GARDEN TOGETHER!

JAM – Jesus and Me Children's Ministry:

<u>JAM Children's Worship</u>: This ministry provides a morning worship service for children ages 4 thru 5th grade. The service incorporates biblical teaching video and creative learning. Everything you need is supplied for you, the children just need a loving person to be with them. <u>JAM Sunday Night Meals</u>: We meet at 5:30 pm and feed the kids. We need individuals to help with feeding the students on Sunday nights. Food will be picked up we need servers and clean-up. After the meal we have a worship service with Andy Walters sharing a message. <u>Sunday Morning Nursery/Preschool Ministry Team</u>: This ministry focuses on nurturing and teaching our young children about the love of Jesus Christ. These volunteers rotate on a regular basis as they serve in our nursery and preschool ministry each Sunday morning during worship.

Rootz Student Ministry:

Youth Ministry Team: This ministry focuses on helping our teenagers grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ as well as with other Christians. There are various opportunities to serve in an on-going role in this ministry. Sunday mornings, Sunday nights as well as Wednesday evenings with JAM ministry youth.

Wednesday Night JAM Ministry:

On Wednesday nights all students meet together for a meal, worship and Bible study. We currently need individuals in all areas.

Joy Garden's (Just Older Youth)

Our senior adults make up this ministry. Currently they are meeting once a month for food and Christian fellowship.

Transportation Ministry Team:

This ministry provides transportation for those who need assistance to attend our worship services. We currently need individuals on Sunday morning and Wednesday evenings.

Greeter/Usher Ministry Team:

<u>Greeters:</u> The Welcome Team strives to set a Christian example of the Body of Christ as members of God's family by giving guests a warm and comfortable welcome. They provide guests with information about the church and place them in appropriate Small Group Bible studies. <u>Ushers:</u> These men help with taking up the offering and passing out bulletins with a smile to make everyone feel welcome. <u>Security/Patrolling Ushers:</u> This ministry provides security during Sunday worship services for our building and our parking lot.

Sound/Audio Visual Ministry Team:

This ministry helps with worship services/events/meetings by providing quality sound and audio-visual enhancement. Training will be provided so experience is not necessary.

Choir and Musicians:

The Choir leads worship in the Sunday morning worship services. If you sing or play an instrument this could be the place for you!

Women on Mission:

This essentially encompasses the "women on mission" of the church. Project JFK (Our ministry to John F. Kennedy Elementary) and the Operation Christmas Child (Shoebox Ministry) are just a couple of the mission opportunities our women take on each year. Every other month our ladies meet for what we call "WMU Garden Party" and do a one day Bible study with snacks and wonderful fellowship.

Brotherhood:

The purpose of this ministry is to plan mission/ministry projects and fellowships that bring men together and reach out to our community.

Outreach

<u>COA Team</u> (Community Outreach Activities): This team helps our church to plan and implement various creative outreach events such as Trunk and Treat, Spring Fling, and more.

<u>Card Ministry:</u> This group writes cards to guests and members as a way to provide encouragement and follow up from our church. <u>Food Ministry Team:</u> This ministry provides food for members during times of grief.

Grief Ministry Team: This ministry provides assistance/ministerial care to our members during times of grief. They help during times of grief by organizing meals, prayer support, counsel, and visits of support and encouragement.
